Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week, November 1-7

If your home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace/wood stove or an attached garage, you must have a working CO alarm <u>adjacent to each sleeping area of the home</u>. For added protection, install a carbon monoxide alarm on every level of the home according to manufacturer's instructions.



Know the symptoms of CO: Exposure to CO can cause flu-like symptoms such as headaches, nausea, dizziness, as well as confusion, drowsiness, loss of consciousness and death.

- > If your CO alarm sounds, and you or other occupants suffer from symptoms of CO poisoning, get everyone out of the home immediately; then call 9-1-1 or your local emergency services number from outside the building.
- > If your CO alarm sounds, and no one is suffering from symptoms of CO poisoning, check to see if the battery needs replacing, or the alarm has reached its "end-of-life" before calling 9-1-1.

Know the sound of your CO alarm: Your CO alarm sounds different than your smoke alarm. Know the difference between the low-battery warning, the "end-of-life" warning, and the alarm alerting you to the presence of CO in your home.
